Shahed Ahmed

Shahed Ahmed Shahed is an experienced Headteacher and National Leader of Education. As a Headteacher, he has led the turnaround of failing and weak schools to achieve Ofsted outstanding judgements. As a NLE, he has supported a range of struggling schools in different local authorities, leading to good and outstanding Ofsted outcomes. He initiated and led the formation of New Vision Trust and has been its CEO since inception in March 2018. Shahed has regularly advised the government over many years on key education issues and has been a member of a number of expert advisory committees for the DfE.
